Jay P. Lefkowitz

On October 20, 2003, Jay P. Lefkowitz, a former senior White House policy advisor to President George W. Bush, rejoined Kirkland & Ellis LLP as a Partner where he has resumed his commercial litigation and strategic counseling practice.

Mr. Lefkowitz left Kirkland & Ellis in March 2001 when he was named General Counsel of the Office of Management and Budget. In January 2002, President Bush appointed him Deputy Assistant to the President for Domestic Policy, where he coordinated the activities of the Domestic Policy Council. In that role, Mr. Lefkowitz served as a principal advisor to the President on a wide variety of issues including healthcare, education, and transportation policy; stem cell research, biotechnology and patent protection; litigation reform; environmental regulations; and international development.

Mr. Lefkowitz earlier served as Director of Cabinet Affairs and Deputy Executive Secretary to the Domestic Policy Council in the administration of President George Herbert Walker Bush. He has also served as a Member of the United States delegation to the United Nations Human Rights Commission in Geneva, Switzerland.

Mr. Lefkowitz is the author of numerous essays about law, politics, and religion which have appeared in *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Washington Times*, *The Public Interest*, *The Jerusalem Report*, *Commentary* and various other publications.

Mr. Lefkowitz is a 1984 graduate of Columbia University and received his J.D. degree in 1987 from Columbia Law School, where he was a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar. He lives in Chevy Chase, Maryland with his wife and their three children.
